

The TYT in his opening-speech of the 12th session of the State Legislative Assembly announces the HALATUJU as the State Development Policy (Dasar Pembangunan Negeri). These were deliberated and approved by the House.

The HALATUJU was further discussed and approved by the Sabah state Cabinet.

The HALATUJU was announced by YAB Datuk Musa Haji Aman as soon as he was sworn-in as the 13th Chief Minister of Sabah.

This means the the HALATUJU is a legitimate State Development Policy that must be adhere to.

This beg questions: How does the Sabah Development Corridor fits into the HALATUJU and Where is its legitimacy ??

There is no solutions given to this major overlap of policies within the National Development Framework. The consequences is major and it is affecting states within the Federation. Specifically it is affecting Sabah & Sarawak.

One critical issue is in the Funding of Sabah Development Corridor. If other Corridors were to be used as a benchmark, the Federal government is only providing 30% of the development financing, 30% assume from the state and 40% raised from Private Finance Initiative (PFI).

In the case of development corridor in Malaya 30% of fundings comes from each state, 70% comes from the Federal coffers (30% from MOF and 40% through Federal GLCs)

In the case of Sabah, most of the PFI will be raised by State GLC (Yayasan Sabah, Sawit Kinabalu and SEDCO). This means that Sabah as a State have to meet 70% of its development funding requirements.

Therefore if Sabah were to raise its own development funding, do Sabah **NEED** to get Federal Approval for the projects and programs? Does the projects and programs in the Sabah Development Corridor need to go through the High Impact Committee?

In addition, its fair to assume a review of Taxes, Duties & Tariffs and Royalties that is collected from Sabah must be done. Afterall Sabah is funding the bulk of its own development.

Its a direction & guideline to make Sabah an Industrialised & prosperous state within the context & timeframe of Vision 2020.

Which is a waste of effort & resource because Sabah cannot catch-up with the stages of industrial development in Malaya.

Sabah missed the industrialisation opportunity when the PBS government dismantle and sold-off the BERJAYA government Integrated Gas Industrial Project in Labuan in 1987.

Later the myopic PBS government sold off all other associated industrialisation and agriculture programs & projects.

Betrayal of the people's Trust.

Its based on the National OPP2 (NDP) and Vision 2020. All these however have been overtaken by events of 1997 and the OPP3.

For all intend and purposes the OPPS 2 has become an irrelevant document to guide the development of Sabah.

It is not a legitimate development document. Its signed by the then Chief Minister but never been brought for approval by the Cabinet, the State Legislative Assembly or the TYT.

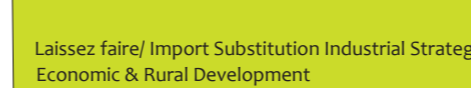
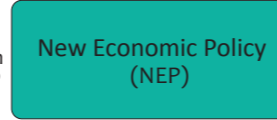

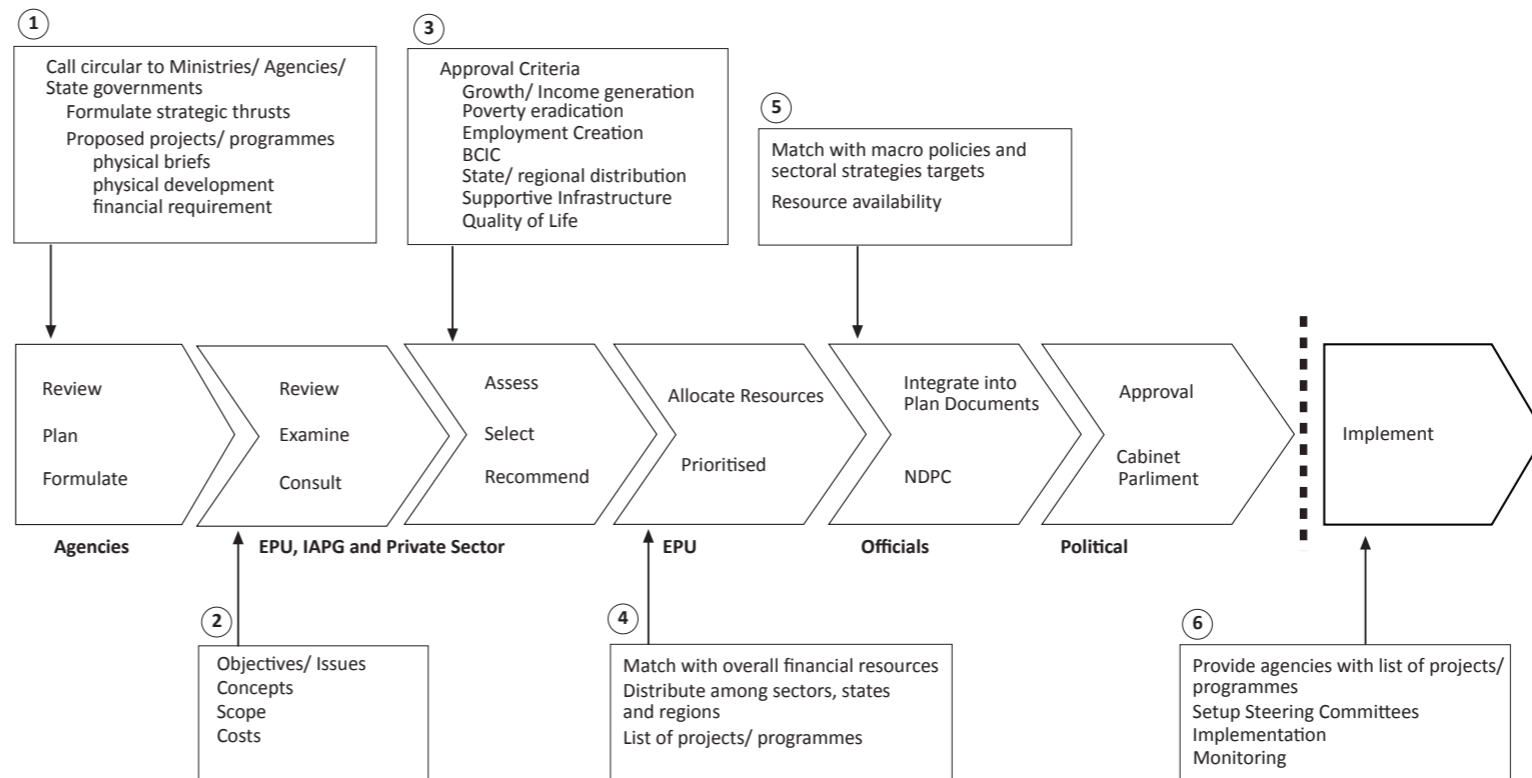
